One Stormy Night

"Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out for fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, 'Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid.' And Peter answered Him and said, 'Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water.' So He said, 'Come.' And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, 'Lord, save me!' And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, 'O you of little faith, why did you doubt?' And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased. Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, 'Truly You are the Son of God.'" (Matt. 14:25-33).

When Jesus first appears to His disciples, they turn to common human superstition to explain what they do not understand (cf. Acts 12:15). It is then that He said to them, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid." There was no mistaking that voice. If Isaac knew the voice of Jacob (Gen. 27:22), and Saul the voice of David (1 Sam. 26:17), and Rhoda the voice of Peter (Acts 12:13), certainly the apostles knew the voice of their Master. Yet, it is His self-identification that stands out to us. He said, "It is I" (which, in the Greek, is "I AM," the same title of deity that God used in Exodus 3:14, and that Jesus used in John 8:58).

It is at this point that Peter asked Jesus to command him to step out of the boat and walk to Him on the water. Jesus said, "Come," and Peter obeyed. It is one thing for God to suspend the laws of gravity and physics to be able to walk on water, but this miraculous occurrence was also now experienced by a mere mortal – and in this scene we recognize that truly "with God all things are possible" (Matt. 19:26).

But when he saw that the waves were boisterous, Peter began to sink, and cried, "Lord, save me!" – and Jesus reached out and caught him. It was at this point that He said to Peter, "...why did you doubt?" Peter had faith to step out of the boat, but He soon took his focus off of Jesus (fearing those scary waves that Jesus Himself had power over); and with his faith now shaken, he began to sink in despair.

After they stepped back into the boat, the wind ceased. On a similar occasion Jesus rebuked the wind and the waves, saying, "Peace! Be still!" (and there was an immediate calm, Mk. 4:39). On that occasion the disciples asked, "Who can this be, that even the wind and the sea obey Him?!" (v. 41); yet, on this occasion they answered their own question: "Truly You are the Son of God."

Friends, when the storms of life beat down upon you, and those boisterous waves give you concern, always remember that the same one who exercised His power over that storm has the power to calm the storms in your life as well. Trust Him. Obey Him. Walk with Him. When things look bleak, always remember His words: "I AM; do not be afraid" – and "with God all things are possible."

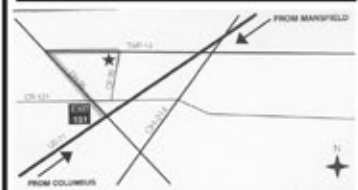

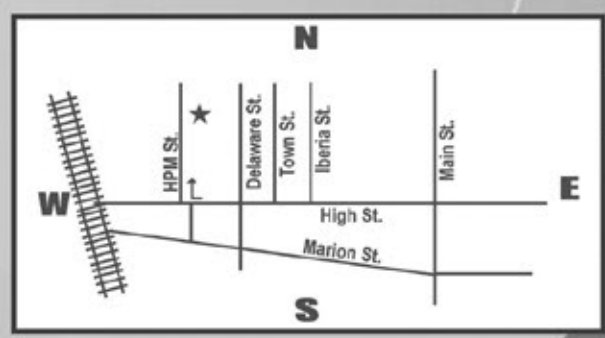

Apply for Agent Orange Benefits

The time frame and locations where U.S. troops were exposed to Agent Orange is much wider and more varied than many might realize. Since 1991, VA has presumed that any veteran who served in Vietnam during the war was exposed to the defoliant and encourages them to apply for benefits.

But eligibility also extends to vets who served along Korea's demilitarized zone during three specific years and those who operated or maintained Agent Orange-contaminated planes in the United States more than a decade after the war.

For benefits purposes, VA presumes vets who served in the following locations during the time frames stated were exposed to Agent Orange:

-In Vietnam, vets must have served on its soil or operated vessels on its inland waterways between Jan. 9, 1962, and May 7, 1975.

-In Korea, vets must have served in or near the DMZ from April 1, 1968, to Aug. 31, 1971.

-At three specific locations in Ohio, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania from 1969-86, Air Force Reservists must have worked on or maintained aircraft that had sprayed the defoliant during the Vietnam War.

Other vets who served during the war at air bases in Thailand, locations where Agent Orange was stored or participated in Pentagon projects to dispose of the defoliant could be eligible, too.

VA provides benefits and compensation to any eligible vet who has any of the following diseases:

- *AL Amyloidosis
- *Peripheral Neuropathy, Early-Onset
- *Chronic B-cell Leukemias
- *Porphyria Cutanea Tarda
- *Chloracne
- *Prostate Cancer
- *Diabetes Mellitus Type 2
- *Respiratory Cancers
- *Hodgkin's Disease
- *Soft Tissue Sarcomas
- *Ischemic Heart Disease
- *Bladder Cancer
- *Multiple Myeloma
- *Hypothyroidism
- *Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma
- *Parkinsonism, or Parkinson-like symptoms
- *Parkinson's Disease

Emergency Financial Assistance

The purpose of emergency financial assistance is to provide temporary financial aid to those who make a conscientious effort to find a permanent solution to their financial problems. Assistance will only be given to those who have a legitimate emergency or hardship as determined by the Veterans Service Commission, and meet the eligibility requirements established by the Ohio Revised Code. It is our intention to assist veterans and their dependents on a short-term basis until a permanent solution to their difficulties can be arranged.

Eligibility Requirements: Section 5901.08 of the Ohio Revised Code establishes eligibility for financial assistance from county veteran service commissions.

- To qualify for assistance, an applicant must demonstrate financial need and unexpected hardship.
- The applicant must be a veteran, an active-duty member of the Armed Forces of the United States, or the spouse, surviving spouse (widow/widower), dependent parent, minor child, or ward of a veteran or active-duty member of the Armed Forces of the U.S.
- Applicants must have been a resident of Morrow County for at least three (3) months prior to the date of application.

DISABILITY BENEFITS FOR VETERANS WHO WERE STATIONED AT CAMP LEJEUNE

VA has established a rule stating that those who were stationed at Camp Lejeune, MCAS New River, including all satellite camps and housing areas, from August 1, 1953 through December 31, 1987 who later developed one of the following 8 diseases can now receive disability benefits:

- *Adult leukemia
- *Parkinson's disease
- *Bladder cancer
- *Kidney cancer
- *Multiple myeloma
- *non-Hodgkin's lymphoma
- *Aplastic anemia & other myelodysplastic syndromes

Presently, these conditions are the only ones for which there is sufficient scientific and medical evidence to support the creation of presumptions; however, VA will continue to review relevant information as it becomes available.

HEALTH BENEFITS

In accordance with the 2012 Camp Lejeune health care law, the VA also provides free health care for certain conditions to Veterans who served at least 30 days of active duty at Camp Lejeune from January 1, 1957 to December 31, 1987.

Qualifying health conditions for free health care include:

- *Esophageal cancer
- *Breast cancer
- *Kidney cancer
- *Multiple myeloma
- *Renal toxicity
- *Female infertility
- *Scleroderma
- *Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma
- *Lung cancer
- *Bladder cancer
- *Leukemia
- *Myelodysplastic syndromes
- *Hepatic steatosis
- *Miscarriage
- *Neurobehavioral effects

Medical Transportation

The Morrow County Veterans Service Commission provides transportation for veterans to the Columbus VA Medical Center (Chalmers P. Wylie) and the Marion VA CBOC.

- If you are using our transportation service, you cannot collect travel pay from the Department of Veterans Affairs. The Federal Government will consider this fraud and may prosecute.
- Each veteran in need of a companion to travel to the appointment is allowed to do so provided it is medically necessary with written notice from the VA clinic or doctor.
- We are available to provide transportation to the Columbus VA Medical Center Monday through Thursday (except for holidays or during Level 3 snow conditions).
- We ask that you schedule your VA medical appointments in the morning before 11:30am so we may be able to accommodate as many veterans as possible.
